

TRAINING PROGRAMME

How to Obtain European Commission Funding

~ A training course for Non-Governmental Organisations ~

Brussels, 13th, 14th and 15th of February 2012 (2.5 days)

The European Commission (EC) programmes are a significant potential source of funding for NGOs, but navigating the complex rules and budget lines, and deciding what will work in a given situation is often daunting. Some EC funding programmes receive a lot of attention from NGOs while others remain unknown and unexploited by organisations.

In addition to this, drafting a comprehensive application under highly competitive conditions often discourages organisations from even applying. Those that do apply frequently end up wasting a lot of time and resources drafting unsuccessful proposals by staff not duly equipped to translate the needs of the organisation into project proposals attractive to the EC. Obtaining funding is often considered a lottery more than anything, and NGOs don't always realise that there is a technique and degree of control behind it. This training will help participants to develop that technique and maximise their organisation's chances of obtaining funding. Participants will also become aware of the myriad of EC funding possibilities available to their NGOs.

Objectives

This course will help organisations:

 be able to identify and understand the relevant funding programme in the field of development aid and external actions;

- understand which are the relevant documents that you need to get familiarised with;
- understand how to adapt your own project to the guidelines of the call for proposals;
- acquire techniques to draft an attractive and highly competitive concept note following the EC format;
- enhance your skills to draft a sound full proposal using as a basis the logframe and to develop the accompanying full proposal and the budget;
- better structure and present the content of your projects.

Although the training is tailored to European Commission funding procedures, the proposal drafting skills acquired during the training are transferable to any other donor.

Participants

The course is tailored to the needs of development, humanitarian, human rights and peacebuilding NGOs seeking to streamline their understanding of the EC funding machinery and enhance their proposal drafting skills. The course is ideally suited to fundraisers and project managers who want to build their fundraising capacity.

Training methodology

The course is based on an interactive approach using practical exercises based on real proposals and numerous examples. The course will enable participants to better understand the perspective of the evaluator that assesses the proposals and thus become able to better tailor their proposals. The course will be carried out in a small group of 15 to guarantee accessibility and an interactive learning environment. In order to work with examples directly relevant to participants, if desired, participants can send their own EC funding proposals to the trainer in advance.

About the trainer

Sonia Herrero is an independent consultant, trainer and facilitator, who has worked for over a decade for both the European Commission and the NGO sector. As a grants officer for the European Commission for six years, she assessed and evaluated hundreds of proposals submitted by NGOs and others. This professional experience gives her a wealth of first-hand knowledge and expertise on what it takes to draft a successful project proposal. After leaving the European Commission she worked with various international organisations for which she successfully designed and executed EC fundraising strategies. Her tasks also included training staff in the particulars of EC fundraising.
