

STUDY ABROAD COURSE AT MADRID, SPAIN

COLLECTIVE MEMORY, HISTORY, AND CONFLICT (NDR 720) (3)

WHEN: JUNE 14 - 22, 2014

This one-week, interdisciplinary, three-credit course enables students to address the various roles that memory can play in conflict engagement. Through lectures and visiting heritage sites, museums, and monuments in Spain students will understand the role of collective memory in conflict.

This course is offered in collaboration with Southern Methodist University (SMU) in Texas and Carlos III University Law School in Spain.
